SIGN ON THE DOTTED LINE

I'm not sure of the grade, but at some point in elementary school, I was taught to write in cursive. I remember trying to write on the dotted lines the flowing letters that did not look anything like the printed letters we had learned earlier. Then I had to learn to sign my name, for my one-of-a-kind signature.

It was a lot of work. But I must admit that my signature today looks nothing like the one I had years ago. Today, it is more or less just a squiggle, indecipherable to anyone, sometimes even including me! After all, why is a signature so important? Fewer and fewer people write letters anymore, they text. If they do need to write a note, they just print it out.

But signatures can have consequences. On July 4th, we celebrate our Independence Day with cookouts, parades, waving flags, and fireworks. It is, for the most part, a lighthearted and festive American holiday. But for the original signers of the Declaration of Independence, declaring independence from England

carried with it great risk. When the 56 members of the Continental Congress signed the Declaration of Independence in 1776, they were, in fact, signing their death warrants. The British Crown considered a declaration of independence an act of treason, which meant that all signatories would be punishable by death.

The Continental Congress, our founding fathers, acknowledge this in the last sentence in the Declaration that reads, "with a firm reliance on the protection of divine providence, we mutually pledge to each other our lives, our fortunes, and our sacred honor." If we take the Declaration of Independence seriously in terms of the words selected, through their signatures they placed all that they had, including their lives, on the dotted line – and trusted God for the outcome.

On this July 4th, if you can find the time, reflect upon the faith that those 56 men had in God when they signed their declaration of independence. Where does our faith in God stand in comparison to theirs? To what would we pledge our lives, our fortunes, and our honor? Good questions to answer, now more than ever.

DID YOU KNOW?

The United States of America is not the only country celebrating an Independence Day this month. While we celebrate our freedom with fireworks on July 4, other countries throughout the world are celebrating their independence in various ways. Burundi Independence Day is July 1, Belarus Independence Day is July 3, and Independence Day in Algeria and Venezuela are both celebrated on July 5. There are several more Independence Days, including Malawi on July 6, Solomon Islands July 7, Argentina July 9, Bahamas July 10, Colombia July 20, Belgium July 21, Liberia and Maldives on July 26, Peru July 28, and Vanuatu (formerly called New Hebrides) on July 30. That's a lot of freedom!

Independence Day in America has some fun facts of its own. John Adams wrote to his wife Abigail that July 4 "will be celebrated, by succeeding Generations, as the great anniversary Festival" and that the celebration should include "Pomp and Parade...Games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and Illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other." By an extraordinary coincidence, Thomas Jefferson and John Adams, the only two signatories of the Declaration of Independence later to serve as presidents of the United States, both died on the same day: July 4, 1826, which was the 50th anniversary of the Declaration. Although not a signatory of the Declaration of Independence, James Monroe, another Founding Father who was elected as president, also died on July 4, 1831, making him the third President who died on the anniversary of independence. The only U.S. president to have been born on Independence Day was Calvin Coolidge, who was born on July 4, 1872.
