NAMES

"I am the good shepherd. I know my own, and my own know me, just as the Father knows me, and I know the Father."

The above passage is from the tenth chapter of John's gospel and from Jesus' discourse on how he is the good shepherd who will watch over and protect his sheep, even to the point of giving his life for their protection. It is an image of Jesus we often use, especially when we – the sheep – are in need of help and renewal. I usually focus upon Jesus' words near the end, when he declares that, as our shepherd, he will lay down his life for his sheep, but will take it up again – references to the crucifixion and resurrection that await him in Jerusalem. But there is something else here, not as significant as the passion, but still important. Jesus declares that he knows us, which to me, also means he knows our names.

At the risk of sounding like the theme song to the sitcom comedy, "Cheers," and its lyrics about the need to go, "Where everybody knows your name, and they're always glad you came", I think knowing names is important, especially in our community of faith. We should make a dedicated effort to learn each other's names. Why? Because it promotes relationships, and just as we relate to God through the loving relationships of the Father, the Son, and the Holy Spirit, we can only become a community of relationships when we become the place where everyone knows each other's names.

Knowing each other starts with knowing names. The Good Shepherd knows each of us by name. Jesus

knows his sheep's birthdays, their passions and longings, their wounds and fears, their sins and failures, the hairs on their heads and their length of days. And while we will never know each other at that level, we can help shepherd each other — and it all begins by knowing each other by learning names.

I challenge you to begin learning names. It all starts with someone you don't know. Don't be embarrassed to ask someone's name, and don't be offended if someone asks for your name. Learning names requires courage, you have to be willing to risk looking foolish at times. It is all part of taking that step toward becoming the faith community God desires. Even more important, it is much easier to "rejoice with those who rejoice" and "weep with those who weep" when we know each other's names.

Next month will be Dot Day, so please wear dots and come out and join us!



SEPTEMBER IS SERVICE DOG MONTH

Did you know that September is National Service Dog Month? National Service Dog Month, celebrated every September, takes place to show appreciation to our four-legged friends who often play a huge role in the lives of human beings. Yes, service dogs are more than just pets since they have been trained to take care of humans suffering from certain ailments, disabilities, or mental health issues. Therefore, the sole purpose of their life becomes to aid their human companion and make their lives easier. This is why it is essential to honor these hard-working pups by dedicating the entire month of September to them.

The purpose of service dogs is to provide companionship, protect, and serve their humans. To bring to light how important service dogs are, National Service Dog Month was formed in 2008.


The idea of this appreciation month was the brainchild of actor Dick Van Patten, who was awestruck by the tremendous help service dogs had given to humans with certain ailments. To further the cause, he also launched a fundraising initiative to benefit these dedicated pups who worked hard every day in service dog training schools. He also became an honorary board member of the Guide Dogs Of The Desert. This led to a chain reaction and gradually, fundraising efforts during National Service Dog Month were made across the U.S.

Dog training schools not only help in creating helpers for humans but also save the lives of many dogs who would otherwise spend their entire lives trapped in shelters. Service dogs are also protected under the Americans With Disabilities Act (ADA).

It all started when a blind man was being led by his dog through Ancient Rome in the first century A. D. and continued in the 1750's with a hospital in Paris kept dogs as helpers for their blind patients. Johann Wilhelm Klein published a manual for coaching guide dogs in 1819, and dog guides for the visually impaired appeared in the U.S. in the 1920's. There are now 8 types of service dogs: Autism Service Dogs, Hearing Dogs, Diabetic Alert Dogs, Seizure Response Dogs, Guide Dogs, Allergy Detection Dogs, Mobility Assistance Dogs, and PTSD Service Dogs.

Their training begins when they are just two-day-old puppies! Most service dogs are Golden Retrievers or Labradors. Nowadays, there are over 500,000 service dogs throughout the U.S. What a wonderful blessing these dogs are to so many people! Be sure to offer some petting to a service dog you may see this month—they provide so much comfort for us, and now we can show our appreciation by providing a little bit of comfort for them, too.
